Overnight Volunteers

As an overnight shelter volunteer, you help prepare and serve dinner and breakfast for up to 80 homeless men. During the night, volunteers watch the security monitors in two-hour shifts. Dinner, breakfast and separate sleeping quarters are provided.

Overnight shelter volunteers work from 6:15 p.m. to 7:30 a.m. the following day. Please contact Anna Donze, our volunteer coordinator, if you are interested in scheduling a group or joining an existing team!

Soup Kitchen volunteers

Lunch shifts run from 9 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday and from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. on Sundays. Volunteers may join a recurring team or sign up as their schedules allow.

Help prepare and serve dinner to overnight shelter guests as a monthly dinner leader. We also need check-in leaders to assist shelter counselors as guests arrive each evening.

Computer Lab Volunteers

The computer lab is only open when volunteers are willing to take a shift. We need one to two volunteers at night to supervise and help quests with basic computer skills. We provide one on one training at your convenience. Shifts are Monday through Thursday, 7:30 p.m. to 10 p.m.

It was a beautiful September morning as 315+ attendees gathered at the Bridger Field House for the annual SAM & Eggs breakfast event to benefit Samaritan Ministries. Planned Giving: Creating a Legacy

We're grateful for several recent estate gifts which enable us to fulfill our mission 365 days and nights a year. Many times, these gifts come from people we do not know. They come from people who have followed our work through the years and have a passion for helping hungry and homeless people.

Individuals can make bequests directly to Samaritan Ministries and also can also consider working with The Winston-Salem Foundation. The Foundation's planned giving staff is available to meet with donors to discuss a variety of lifetime and planned giving options, including life income trusts, retirement assets, and life insurance, all of which can support Foundation endowments that benefit Samaritan Ministries.

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In 2018, an anonymous donor left a bequest to The Winston-Salem Foundation to benefit Samaritan Ministries and another local charity. The Shepherding Fund provides nearly \$40,000 annually for the Ministry. When the Foundation notified Samaritan of the fund, we had already identified a need to expand shelter staff to make check-in for shelter guests more efficient and effective. The Foundation's staff developed a 25-year relationship with the donor which led to a lasting legacy for Samaritan.

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has been faced with many hardships. He arrived at Samaritan in April of 2017, asking for help through tear-filled eyes. Marcus followed the Project Cornerstone and Narcotics Anonymous programs, strengthened his relationship with God, and adopted patience and persistence.

The day of the event marked 29 months of sobriety for Marcus. Although he now lives on his own, he is still a very familiar face at Samaritan. In July of 2019, Marcus was hired as a part-time shelter counselor at Samaritan. He helps to provide a safe space for those who seek help just as he did. Marcus is a true testament to the success
