OUR PROGRAMS




The Soup Kitchen operates 7 days a week, 365 days a year, and provides a warm lunch to anyone who is hungry or food insecure. It has never closed in over 15,000 consecutive days. Cost per meal is \$3.66.



Samaritan Inn offers round-the-clock shelter to any homeless man who needs a haven that provides compassion, shelter, sustenance, and support. In 2023, 452 men were provided shelter. Cost for a night of shelter (24 hour care) is \$44.66.



Project Cornerstone was organized at Samaritan in 1995 as a long-term residential 12-step recovery program for former substance abusers. To date 200 men have completed the program and have become self sufficient.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP



Since 2018, **United Health Centers** has given access to free health care and an opportunity to develop a primary care physician relationship to people experiencing homelessness. The clinic provided free medical treatment with **187 visits in 2023, a 34% increase over 2022.**

THE IMPACT OF YOUR SUPPORT



Brian C., a retired firefighter, came to Samaritan Ministries after experiencing a broken relationship, being abandoned and his monthly pension stolen. These events lead to a suicide attempt and him refusing treatment for health issues which were later diagnosed as cancer. He was released from a mental health treatment facility with nowhere to go. He found Samaritan Ministries, and a friend in our Assistant Director Marcus Houston.

They met on a regular basis and he began his cancer treatments, secured his pension payments, and with Marcus's assistance he was able to find a stable home on his own.
